

1 The surfer closest to the peak has right of way




4 If you are paddling back out and another surfer is riding a wave in front of you you must paddle for the white water NOT the shoulder, or open face of the wave. This allows the surfer to have a clear wave.




When surfing a peak, after your wave do not paddle back out past the other surfers waiting. Get to the back of the queue and wait your turn.



When surfing a peak or a pointbreak wave and it's your turn if you paddle for the wave and miss it you go to the back of the line.



When paddling out don't go straight through the surf zone. Paddle wide to avoid interfering or colliding with another surfer.
